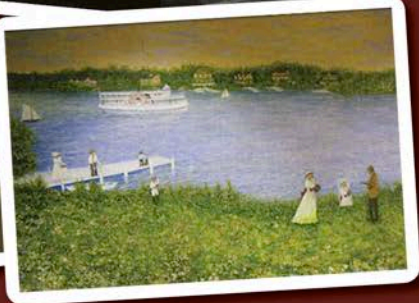


MAIN STREET, LAKE GENEVA 1830 - 1930

Begin your tour with a visit to the Potawatomi lakeside village depicting how our native settlers might have lived. Then come meet our cow Molly and Fibber, our farm work horse, in our agricultural exhibit complete with creamery. As you stroll down the museum's Main Street, peek into recreations of former businesses, including the general store, post office, lawyer's office, and the firehouse, complete with a 1917 fire engine. Stroll through the 1880s Victorian parlor, appreciate the Edwardian 1910s dining room, and don't miss the 1929 Model A Ford.

Continue your visit in the museum's North Gallery where you'll find vignettes of Yerkes Observatory, Black Point, Lake Ivanhoe and the Frank Lloyd Wright designed Geneva Hotel. There are also examples of Geneva Lake's nautical heritage, a stagecoach, the Boyd Carriage and numerous displays of historical significance, including the former Playboy Club. Ceylon Court, from the 1893 World's Fair, has been brought to life in a complete walk-in gallery. Finally, marvel at the beautiful stained glass windows from the Crane Estate "Jerseyhurst".
